National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) is the largest grassroots mental health organization in the country. NAMI KDK is a local affiliate of NAMI that serves Kane-South, DeKalb, and Kendall Counties.

NAMI KDK's INC-funded community support programs include
Connections, Family, BIPOC, Spanish, LGBTQ+, and Teens. Education
services include Family-to-Family, Ending the Silence, NAMI
Homefront, NAMI Friends & Family, and NAMI Basics. Educational

presentations include In Our Own Voice, Compartiendo Esperanza, Sharing Hope, and custom presentations. NAMI KDK helps individuals that are enrolled in Treatment Alternative Court (TAC) with expenses such as bus passes and gift cards. The agency is also in the planning stage for peer support and peer support specialists.


May 7-13 is National Prevention Week



National Prevention Week is dedicated to raising awareness about substance use prevention and mental health. The significance of having National Prevention Week in May is that it falls just before summer break, when children often have a lot of time on their hands and may be left unsupervised while parents are at work, which could lead to higher risk behavior.

This year, INC-funded agency Mutual Ground will be working with

students from the Snowflake after school club held at Harter Middle School in Sugar Grove to increase awareness during National Prevention Week. The students will research various drugs and read the facts they learned over the morning announcements during the week. One day will be dedicated to facts on mental health as well. Some of the students will design posters based on what they learned and share them in the school for everyone to learn about the harms of drug use. The students' research on drugs will also be announced during the morning announcements at Kaneland High School so that both schools benefit from the information discovered.
